Two points to note today

Psychological evidence shows: Human behavior is more determined by the situation/context than the features of the individual (encultured beliefs, personality)

Thus, road safety can be improved by use of the road to limit crashes (barriers) and improve behavior

Culture influences the Management of Road Safety, which influence behavior and outcomes.

#### Japan

One of the best performing Road Safety countries globally.

- Well under half the global average deaths per 100,000 people for High Income Countries: Really great for a large country not a mostly city state
- Leading car technology, excellent JapanNCAP, requiring ABS on motorcycles, excellent laws: BAC limit of .03 (.1 or .08 in many countries).

Compliant culture already as a base: huge Seatbelt wearing rates, one of the lowest murder and violent crime rates on earth.





In Japan I see many roads which provide protection and contexts which guide low speeds, and facilitate active slow transport

 Japan is poised for well managed culture change for road safety
 Most countries

are not.

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Safe System is influenced by culture and culture is influence by safe system

- Creating a culture which supports safe system and demands it from our politicians is a huge step. We need to resist many mistaken views:
  - Crashes are inevitable
  - Deaths are the price of mobility
  - Higher speed is economically better
  - We can fix people to not make mistakes.
- Culture and deterrence can minimize some mistakes: speeding, drink-driving, not wearing a seatbelt
- But not others: momentary lapses, medical episodes, misjudgements, lapses of concentration, micro sleeps.

Thus: we need the right culture and the right system: they work together

A focus on road safety culture can help all this.
